Friends in Action- Museum Passes

Did you know that your library card unlocks more than just books? Thanks to the generous support of the Friends of the Library, you can now explore over 25 local museums, historical sites, and zoos—completely free of charge!

Whether you're interested in art, history, nature, or wildlife, these passes provide free admission to some of the area's most popular destinations. It's a fantastic way to enjoy educational and inspiring outings with your family, friends, or on your own.

In 2024, museum passes were borrowed 935 times, representing a 47% increase in usage from previous years! Some of the most popular check-outs included destinations like the Academy of Natural Sciences, Woodford Cedar Run, Museum of the American Revolution, Battleship New Jersey, MoMA, and the Please Touch Museum.

Best of all, this program is fully funded by the Friends of the Library. In fact, the cost of one single ticket to some of these attractions is often more than the price of an annual Friends of the Library family membership, which starts at just \$25!

The Friends of the Library also fund the software that allows many passes to be printed at home or shown directly on your phone, making it easier than ever to access these exciting destinations on your own schedule.

So next time you're planning a weekend adventure or looking for a fun, educational outing, check out the museum pass program. It's just one more way your library — and the Friends who support it — are helping you discover, learn, and grow.



Friendly Book Review: <u>Papilio</u> by Ben Clanton, Corey R. Tabor, and Andy Chou Musser


Papilio is a unique picture book/chapter book told in three parts by three talented author/illustrators. Each short chapter focuses on a different phase of Papilio's development, from bursting out of her egg with great excitement to take on the world as a caterpillar to gaining the confidence to spread her butterfly wings and fly. Along the way, Papilio learns that the world is topsy-turvy and full of surprises, and that growing up can be a bumpy ride. But with help from a friendly mouse to face the challenges along the way, Papilio discovers how sweet the world can be.

History Tidbit


Did you know that the **Moorestown Free Library Association** is the official name of the Friends of the Moorestown Library?




Grab and Go Crafts are super popular all year and are funded by the Friends!
